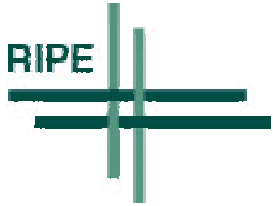




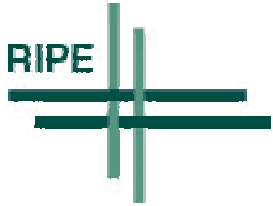
RIPE46 EIX-WG Report

 - 2nd session: in-depth presentations and discussion



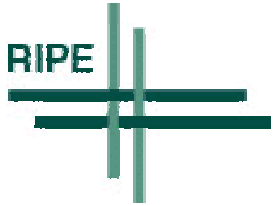
11 IXP Reports

- Steady growth of most IXPs, despite continuing consolidation
- Gig E widely deployed, increasing deployment of 10GE and overhauling of platforms
- Increase in housing of anycast root and ccTLD at IXPs
- One exchange in DE is also setting up a “social network” to foster growth in Eastern EU areas



v6 Status

- Widely deployed on peering meshes
- Most exchanges are live with v6, or have advanced plans
- Again the issue of getting v6 addressing for the IXP's "support infrastructure" was raised
- It was suggested to continue this on the mailing list



Euro-IX

- Upcoming members' meeting in Lisbon
- Continuing deployment of web-based information sharing tools
 - New peering “overlap” matrix
 - Help identify new peering opportunities
- Financial support for the Quagga routing package



Other Items

- Inter-provider Traffic Analyser (MIX)
 - A stats correlation tool for flows across IXP
- Anycast developments of root servers
 - F, I, and K spoke about their anycast plans and what they were looking for from hosts
- PCH IXP database (Bill Woodcock)
 - Reminder to contribute to this, and that it tracks “gossip” as well as live exchanges
