•Registration Services are based on Sao Paulo Brazil.









IPv4 DISTRIBUTION BY COUNTRY






IPv4/24 ALLOCATED PER QUARTER













ASN DISTRIBUTION BY COUNTRY






ASN ASSIGNMENT PER QUARTER




MEMBERSHIP DISTRIBUTION BY COUNTRY


